# What We're Learning Next



<u>**Reading:**</u> In reading we will be learning how to retell the important parts of the story such as, characters, setting, problem, and solution. We will also be identifying the author's purpose. Does the author want to entertain, persuade, or to inform us. Discuss this with you child while you are reading their book envelope with them this week. AKS: Describe the overall structure of a story, including describing how the beginning introduces the story and the ending concludes the action (CCOPS) (2LA\_A2012-S/ELACC2RLS)

<u>Writing</u>: We will be publishing our first personal narrative. We can't wait to show you all of our hard work at conferences. AKS: Write narratives in which they recount a well-elaborated event or short sequence of events, include details to describe actions, thoughts, and feelings, use temporal words to signal event order, and provide a sense of closure (CCOPS) (2LA\_D2012-24)

<u>Math:</u> We will begin part 2 of our place value base 10 unit. We will be exploring writing humbers in expanded form. AKS: explain the numbers 100, 200, 300, 400, 500, 600, 700, 800, 900 refer to one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, or nine hundreds (and 0 tens and 0 ones) (CCOPS) (2MA\_B2012-9)

 $\underline{\text{Science:}}$  We will continue our unit on the life cycle of a plant. Look for a study guide to come home on Tuesday.

AKS: investigate the life cycles of different organisms to understand the diversity of life. (GPS) (2SC\_D2007-13)

<u>Social Studies:</u> We will begin exploring the lives of James Oglethorpe, Mary Musgrave, and Tomochichi. AKS: Describe the cultural and geographic systems associated with James Oglethorpe, Tomochichi, and Mary Musgrove (GPS) (2SS\_D2008-21)

Word Work: We will begin to explore the meaning of words using ear and ear word patterns this week. -ea sea, tea, bead
